### Key Trends of 2018 at a Glance

The year ended with a persisting digital divide, with a little less than half the global population yet to be connected online. Access, availability, affordability, relevance of content and language continued to be the top factors contributing to this anomaly. In India the National Digital Communications Policy (NDCP) came into effect, where one of the objectives has been to connect the balance 70% Indians.

Key trends of 2018 include discussions on privacy and data protection; cyber security, liabilities and obligations of internet companies; net neutrality; content regulation; misinformation; digital trade; emerging technologies such as Artificial Intelligence (AI).

With the European Union's (EU) General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) coming into effect along with reports of data breach (Cambridge Analytica, Marriot, Orbitz, Equifax, Amazon, Facebook, Google+, SingHealth, Reddit, Conrail, etc.), discussions on privacy and data protection came to the forefront. Across the globe various nations initiated drafting their national data protection or privacy laws. In India the Justice BN Srikrishna Committee on Data protection submitted the draft Personal Data Protection Bill 2018 to the government for further deliberation. Further the Supreme Court of India upheld the constitutional validity of Aadhaar, the 12-digit unique identification number issued to Indian citizens, and ruled that it does not infringe on an individual's right to privacy.

Liabilities and obligations of internet companies were much discussed. Governments in many countries, including India are now arguing for data localization. There is a growing trend of governments negotiating to have their presence in the office of the online companies, such as the agreement between French government and Facebook.

Fake news was much discussed. This has also resulted in a growing trend of governments attempting to regulate the online companies and freedom of speech online. Papua and New Guinea announced a ban on Facebook for a month to curb fake news; Uganda proposed to tax the social media and messaging apps to curb online gossip; Egypt passed a law to regulate taxi sharing apps and a cybercrime law to regulate web content and ISP surveillance; Cambodia passed a regulation to monitor news and social media; Australia introduced the Assistance and Access Bill, to name a few.

Cybersecurity remained another much discussed topic, with an emphasis on the role of governments and collaboration. In this regard, the French President Macron launched the "Paris Call for Trust and Security in Cyberspace"; the Global Commission on the Stability of Cyberspace (GCSC) released the 'Singapore package, thirty global companies signed the Cybersecurity Tech Accord; Heads of Commonwealth Governments adopted the Commonwealth Cyber Declaration, are some such examples. With growing cyber threats, this year, several countries updated their cyber defense policies such as the European Commission (EU Cyber defense policy framework); US (Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency Act of 2018 and Cyber Strategy 2018) and China.

In terms of digital commerce, the discussions revolved round the growing digital economy and taxation on digital commerce. During the 11th WTO Ministerial Conference (MC11), seventy one member states signed the Joint Statement on Electronic Commerce. This year marked the rise in trade tensions between US and China; , the European Commission proposing new rules for digital taxation, UK considering taxing revenue of Internet corporations and the Australian government proposing to collect a fee for internet shopping.

Governance and ethics of emerging technologies such as AI was another topic discussed. Data protection authorities of over 15 countries signed the “Declaration on Ethics and Data Protection in Artificial Intelligence”; twenty five European countries adopted a Declaration of Cooperation on Artificial Intelligence (AI); European Commission outlined a European approach to boost investment and set ethical guidelines on AI; Singapore launched AI governance and ethics initiatives; the G7 Summit leaders endorsed a 'Common vision for the future of artificial intelligence (AI) and in India Niti Ayog released a discussion paper on the National Strategy For Artificial Intelligence. Further, Microsoft launched AI for Accessibility while Google outlined their AI principles.

## December Highlights

Privacy and data protection continued to be a much discussed topic in December. Australia [passed](#) the controversial Assistance and Access Bill that grants, law enforcement agencies access to encrypted messages of technology companies. The [released](#) confidential internal Facebook e-mails by UK Parliamentary Committee on how special access of user data were shared with other companies, once again raised the question of privacy and security of user data. In India the Union Cabinet [cleared](#) the legal changes necessary to amend the Telegraph Act, Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) and the Aadhaar Act in keeping with the [Supreme Court decision to strike down](#) a section in the [Aadhaar law that allowed private companies](#) to demand that their customers provide their 12-digit unique identification number. As a next step the [Aadhar and Other Laws Amendment and bill 2018](#) was tabled in the lok sabha on 2 January.

Artificial Intelligence and its regulation were much discussed. The USA-based AI Now Institute, in their report “[AI Now 2018 Report](#) recommended governments to regulate AI 'by expanding the powers of the sector-specific agencies to oversee, audit, and monitor AI technologies by domain'. The European Commission presented a [Coordinated Plan to foster the development and use of artificial intelligence \(AI\) in Europe](#).

There were several reports of data breach this month. A [report](#) by Symantec revealed details of the Seedworm cyber espionage attack in 2017-2018 that affected several telecom and IT services servicing oil and gas sectors in Pakistan, Turkey, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Afghanistan, Jordan, and organisations in Europe and North America that have ties to the Middle East. The reported [Marriot Data breach](#) of 2014 exposed nearly 500 million records and made the database vulnerable since then. It was [reported](#) that a Facebook bug may have affected 6.8 million users and 1500 apps developed by 876 developers during a 12-day period in September. Further, The [Segrite Quaterly Threat Report Q3 2018](#) reveals that Indian enterprises face around .28 million cyber threats each day.

Cybersecurity remained a top priority for most nations. The United Kingdom announced the launch of a [new cyber skills strategy](#). In EU, [the European Union Agency for Network and Information Security \(ENISA\)](#) will become the EU Agency for Cybersecurity with a permanent mandate. The Indian government think tank Niti Aayog in the document [Strategy for New India @ 75](#) emphasises on the relevance of digital infrastructure for economic growth, and need to eliminate the digital divide by 2022-23. The document advocates for a comprehensive cybersecurity framework and need to address the constraints in broadband access.

Misinformation and fake news continued to be discussed in December. In a bid to fight fake news the Ministry of Electronics and IT (MeitY), Government of India is inviting comments on the draft of "[The Information Technology \[Intermediary Guidelines \(Amendment\) Rules\] 2018](#)" by 15 January.

## ICANN Updates

This month, ICANN published "[Five Years of the Latin America and the Caribbean \(LAC\) Strategy](#)," highlighting the milestones achieved by the LAC community; the annual [Internet Assigned Numbers Authority \(IANA\) Customer Survey Findings and the Draft Operating Plan and Budget for Fiscal Year 2020](#) which is open for community feedback. For FY20, the operating budget forecates a minimal growth in the funding to at \$140.1 million, up 2% from FY19, while the expenses are budgeted below funding at \$137.1 million.

Besides, this month the ten member Technical Study Group on Access to Non-Public Registration Data (TSG-RD) coordinated by [Ram Mohan](#), initiated their work to explore technical solutions for providing third parties access to non-public data via RDAP.

## ISOC Updates

This month ISOC organised the global [InterCommunity 2018 event](#) on 4 December where all the ISOC members participated online. [Benin Chapter's project in IoT Low Hightech](#) 'A connected object creation workshop', won the first prize this year's [Chapterthon](#) award. Also, ISOC announced the appointment of Rinalia Abdul Rahim as Senior Vice President of Strategy and Implementation.

### APAC News:

This month, three webinars were organized by Chapters from the region. These include discussions on open Internet - routing security, diversity and inclusion and cybersecurity.

**Chapter members based in Hyderabad** in collaboration with free software advocate organisation, Swecha, organised a webinar on routing security. Dr. Kotikalapudi Sriram from the [National Institute of Standards and Technology](#), USA, delivered a talk titled, "[Internet Routing Security: Vulnerabilities and Mitigation Techniques](#)."

**India Delhi Chapter** organised a [webinar](#) on [Diversity and Inclusion](#). The session was moderated by Subhashish Panigrahi and Amrita Choudhury. Japleen Pasricha from Feminism in India present her views on [diversity and gender inclusion](#) while highlighting issues leading to gender digital divide and online violence against women. This was followed by a discussion among chapter representatives from the region on the current practices in their countries and chapters for improving diversity and gender inclusion. The chapter representatives who shared their views include, Shveta Kokash, ISOC Mumbai; Cherie Lagakali, PICISOC; Musyriyah Mahmud, ISOC Malaysia; Sagarika Wickramasekera and Poornima Meegamma, ISOC

Sri Lanka; Bikram Shrestha, ISOC Nepal; and Shabana Mansoor, ISOC Afghanistan. It was also felt that the discussion on the subject needs to be continued further.

The third [webinar](#) was organised by the **APAC Bureau** titled, "[Citizen Co-production of Cybersecurity: Self-help, Vigilantes and Cybercrime](#)" and Dr. Lennon Chang, Senior Lecturer in Criminology in the School of Social Sciences at Monash University, Australia delivered a talk on the safeguards and guidelines for constructive citizen/netizen co-production of cybersecurity.

In the month of December, APNIC participated in the [23<sup>rd</sup> Pacific Network Operators Group \(PacNOG 23\)](#) in the Marshall Islands and Nepal Network Operators Group ([npNOG](#)) in Kathmandu.

The APNIC [Executive Council \(EC\)](#) published their response to the 2018 APNIC survey.

As a part of the Address Supporting Organization Address Council (ASO AC), APNIC invited [comments](#) from the community by 15 January, for the [Seat 10 of the ICANN Board of Directors](#). The nominated candidates are Dmitry Burkov, Akinori Maemura, and Andile Ngcaba.

For the APRICOT 2019 conference to be held at Daejeon South Korea from 18-28 February, [presentations and tutorials](#) are invited, by 25 January while [suggestions to improve the current policies or new policy proposals](#) are invited by 18 January.

## TRAI Updates

In the month of December, Trai released the [Seventh Amendment of the Telecommunication Mobile Number Portability Regulations, 2018](#); list of [maximum Retail Price \(MRP\) of Pay TV Channels](#); the [implementation of New Regulatory Framework for Broadcasting & Cable Services Sector](#) and the [Amendment of the Telecom Commercial Communications Customer Preference Regulations, 2018](#).

Besides the Regulator extended the comment submission period for the consultation papers on [Regulatory Framework for Over-The-Top \(OTT\) Communication Services](#), to [7 January](#) and [Review of extant provision for sending the printed bills to consumers of landline and postpaid Mobile subscribers](#) to [8 January](#).

## Round Table Meet

This month, the Internet Governance division of the Ministry of Electronics and IT organised two round table discussions which were chaired by the Joint Secretary Mr. Jaideep Kumar Mishra. The aim of the roundtables was to gather comments and responses from different stakeholders on two policy tracks of ICANN which were open to public comments.

The first roundtable held on 11 December, was on the New gTLD Subsequent Procedures Policy Development Process. The session was moderated by Mr. T. Santosh, Scientist E from the ministry. After sharing an overview on the subject and the draft response prepared by MeitY and NIXI in response to the Supplemental Report, open for public comments till 12 December, the participants were encouraged to share their comments on the draft response..

The second roundtable, held on 12 December was on the [‘Initial Report of the Temporary Specification for gTLD Registration Data Expedited Policy Development Process’](#) open for public comments till 21 December. The roundtable was moderated by Mr. Rahul Gossain, Director in the ministry. Apart from sharing an overview on the subject, participants were encouraged to share their perspectives on the key questions being asked in the paper.

## CCAOI organizes an online discussion of TRAI OTT Paper

CCAOI organised an online discussion on the TRAI consultation paper on [Regulatory Framework for OTT communication services](#) on 7 December. The event was supported by the Internet Society, Delhi Chapter. The aim of this discussion was to provide more clarity to the community on the subject and questions asked in the paper and encourage different community members to make their submission to TRAI.

The 90 mins discussion began with a brief overview of the consultation paper by Shashank Mishra from Shardul Amarchand Mangaldas, followed by expert opinion from our guest speakers T. V. Ramachandran from Broadband India Forum; Rajesh Chharia from Internet Service Providers Association of India (ISPAI) and Ramanjit Cheema from India Freedom Foundation (IFF). The discussion was very balanced having different perspectives being shared by the participating speakers. This was followed by an open discussion and question answer session.

In terms of participation, the webinar was attended by nearly 40 participants from different stakeholder communities. The general feedback was it was a very useful and people would like to attend 'such informative' sessions in future.
