## **January Highlights**

In the month of January, Artificial Intelligence, data protection, cyber security, content regulation, intermediary liability and digital commerce was much discussed. In the Indian context, the discussions revolved around the Intermediary Guidelines Amendment, the consulation paper on OTT communication services, the eCommerce bill and ways to curb fake news.

This month witnessed instances where regulators imposed penalties on organizations for data breaches or non compliances to data protection. Google was fined €50 million by the the French data regulator over issues related to lack of transparency and consent; SingHealth and Singapore's public healthcare sector agency (IHIS) were <u>fined</u> with penalties amounting to one million dollars, after a data breach incident in July 201 where data of over 1.5 patients were compromised. Kenya enacted <u>amendments</u> in their national identification law that will enable the state to collect more precise data when issuing identification documents. There were reports that Germany's anti-trust body is considering to order Facebook to stop gathering unspecified user data

In terms of data breach, a <u>WhatsApp bug</u> was reported to have deleted users' messages and leaked previous information of owner's; <u>Airbus</u> reported a data breach; a research conducted by AntiToxin Technologies and TechCrunch <u>highlighted</u> that Microsoft's Bing search engine shows child pornography images as well as provides suggestions for other disturbing search phrases when the SafeSearch filter option is switched off. In India there were reports of account data of millions of <u>SBI bank users being leaked</u> however it was later denied by the bank and UIDAI authorities.

In terms of content regulation and fight against fake news, the Japanese Ministry of Information and Ministry of Internal affairs <u>announced</u> setting up guidelines to tackle the spread of misinformation online especially during electoral campaigns and natural disasters. authorities <u>Communication ban</u> was reported in Zimbabwe along with internet shut down. In India, the community was invited to submit their comments on the Intermdiary Guidelines Amendment in the IT Act, <u>ShareChat banned</u> 50,000 profiles to keep pornographic, violent and fake content off of its platform; OTT providers such as Netflix, Hotstar, Voot, Zee5, Arre, SonyLIV, ALT Balaji and Eros Now under the aegis of the Internet and Mobile Association of India (IAMAI) has released a document called "Code of best practices for online curated content providers."

This month witnessed discussions pertaining to online car aggregators, with the French Appeal Court<u>ruling that</u> <u>diver of Uber</u> were effectively an employee of the company, Uber India issuing <u>community guidelines</u> for drivers and commuters; Indonesian regulators preparing to <u>fix the rates</u> for drivers for 'ride-hailing services'

In terms of digital commerce, Indonesian government proposed to bring in a <a href="mailto:new-law">new law</a> whereby e-commerce sellers will have to share data with authorities and pay VAT and income taxes; Singapore Land Transport Authority (LTA) together with Enterprise Singapore, Standards Development Organisation and Singapore Standards Council developed a set of preliminary national standards for driverless vehicles. In India, a <a href="mailto:new-ecommerce-policy">new-ecommerce-policy</a> related to FDI was implemented on 1 February, wherein a market place entity having 100% ownership or controlling interest cannot generate more than 25% of its sales through the market place by itself or group companies. While this policy has been welcomed by offline retailers as a move that will bosst their business and <a href="mailto:antitust advocates stating">antitust advocates stating</a> it will stop technology companies from forming monopolies, there are others who argue that it is <a href="mailto:against consumer interest">against consumer interest</a> as it will hike the prices of commodities and will harm foreign investments in the country.

## CCAOI & ISOC Delhi organizes an online discussion on Intermediary Guideline Paper

CCAOI and ISOC Delhi jointly organised an interactive webinar on the "The Information Technology Intermediary Guidelines (Amendment) Rules 2018" to encourage members and Indian stakeholders to understand and submit their comments on the proposed draft rules that seek to modify existing regulation on due diligence which the intermediaries need to adhere, while discharging their duties as per Section 79(2)(c) of the Information Technology Act, 2000. The session was moderated by Subhashish Panigrahi, Chapter Development Manager APAC, Internet Society and Amrita Choudhury, Treasurer Delhi Chapter and Director CCAOI. The speakers in the session were Shashank Misra, Senior Associate, Shardul Amarchand Mangaldas & Co. Nehaa Chaudhari, Public Policy Lead, Ikigai Law, Paul Brooks Chair Internet Australia, Arjun Sinha, Tech Lawyer and Gurshabad Grover, Policy Officer, CIS India. ## **ICANN Updates**

In the month of January, ICANN published the <u>second Security and Stability Advisory Committee (SSAC2) Review: Final Report</u> that includes an assessment of the SSAC, comprising of 22 findings and 30 recommendations for improving its operations; the <u>ICANN Organization Memo on the Implementation of the Procedure for Release of Two-Character Labels and Standard Measures to Avoid Confusion with <u>Corresponding Country Codes</u> and the <u>Historical Overview of Events Regarding Two-Character Labels at the Second Level in the New gTLD Namespace</u>; a <u>recording</u>, of a recent discussion on consumer safeguards in the Domain Name System (DNS) along with a <u>presentation</u>. Besides, the ICANN Borad also announced the creation of a Working Group on Anti-Harassment.</u>

ICANN announced that the <u>2019 Middle East DNS Forum (MEDNSF)</u> will be held in Dubai, United Arab Emirates (UAE) from 20-21 February and hosted by the Telecommunications Regulatory Authority (<u>TRA</u>) of the UAE. The sixth MEDNSF will be held in conjunction with another regional event – the 75<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Asia Pacific Top-Level Domain Association (<u>APTLD75</u>).

Comments are invited on the <u>Amendment to the IANA Naming Functions Contract</u>, <u>Annex A</u> by 18 February and the updated Draft Operating Standards for Specific Reviews (Operating Standards) by 11 February.

Nominations are now invited by NOMCOM for the NOMCOM 2019 ICANN and PTI leadership positions (3 ICANN Board of Directors, 3 At-Large Advisory Committee, 2 GNSO, 1 ccNSO and 1 PTI Board of Directors) till 18 March 2019.

## **ISOC Updates**

This month, the ISOC President and CEO Andrew Sullivan shared a message with members on ISOCs mission and vision for the year 2019; launched a <u>9 step Privacy Code of Conduct for organizations</u>; organised online session to share on the new Chapter Performance Evaluation. Criteria, and gather feedback from Chapter Leaders and Members. Members were encouraged to participate in surveys - the InterCommunity 2018 Post Show Survey and the 2019 Chapter Survey

Nominations are invited for the <u>three positions</u> of the <u>Public Interest Registry (PIR) Board</u> by 4 February 2019 and Internet Hall of Fame.

#### **APAC News:**

This month, the APAC Regional Bureau facilitated in organizing a webinar by the Delhi Chapter and CCAOI on Intermediary liabilities (details of which has been shared above). An exclusive APAC online session was organized to share the new Chapter Evaluation Criteria among the chapter leaders of the region.

From the policy perspective, Internet Society, Delhi Chapter and Chennai made submissions to TRAI on the consultation paper on OTT Communication services and MeitY on Intermediary Guidleline Amendment Policy 2018.

### ISOC India-Delhi Chapter elects new Leadership team

# **APNIC Highlights**

In the month of January, APNIC participated in events such as SANOG33 in Thimpu, Bhutan and JANOG43 in Yamanashi, Japan. The Address Supporting Organization Address Council (ASO AC) re-elected Aftab

Siddiqui, the APNIC community representative, as the Chair of the ASO AC/NRO NC for 2019. Simon Sohel Baroi was appointed as a member of the Number Resource Organization Number Council (NRO NC) representing the APNIC region for a term of one year, while Zulfadly Syam wass appointed to the IANA Numbering Services Review Committee for a two-year term.

Further the community is invited to comment on the <u>2018 IANA Performance Matrix Summary Report</u> by 22 February and nominate suitable candidates for the <u>four APNIC Executive Council positions</u> by 12 February; the three <u>SIG Chairs</u>- Cooperation, NIR and Policy by 25 February.

For the APRICOT 2019 conference to be held at Daejeon South Korea from 18-28 February. Apart from election of EC members and the three SIG Chairs, from the policy perspective, <u>five policies</u> are expected to be discussed during this meeting.

# **TRAI Updates**

In the month of January, Trai released the <u>Telecom Subscription Data as on 30 November, 2018</u> reporting 1.031 billion active mobile connections and <u>the Indian Telecom Services Performance Indicator Report for the Quarter ending September, 2018</u>. As per the quarterly report, India has 559.9 million internet connections, of which majority is on mobile. State wise, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu has the highest number of broadband users.

### Highlights of the Submissions on the OTT consultation paper

There were <u>eighty nine submissions</u> on the consultation paper on <u>Regulatory Framework for Over-The-Top</u> (OTT) <u>Communication Services</u> These include thirteen individual submissions, one by consumer advocay group, seven by service providers, twenty one by companies/organisations/ firms and forty two from associations which include civil society organisations.

Most submissions of associations, individuals, civil societies and OTT players, including broadcasters, argued that services provided by OTTs are not similar to those of Telecom Service Providers (TSPs) (qualitatively, functionally or technologically) and not substitutable. Therefore, OTTs should not be regulated by the policies and regulatory regime of TSPs, since the nature of services offered is different and OTTs are already regulated by the IT Act.

PayTM, an OTT player, however, argued that messaging services (personal, business, video and voice calling) should be regarded as the same or similar to the services provided by TSPs and regulated likewise.

The TSPs and the associations representing them argued that OTT and TSP services are similar and substitutable; they should be regulated similarly, for example, lawful interception requirements should be applied to both; TSPs are losing revenue due to OTT services. There was also an argument proposing relaxed regulatory and licensing regime by allowing similar services to TSPs as that of OTT on the same conditions. There was also a call for data localization from homegrown companies like Jio, PayTM.

There were <u>twelve submissions</u> during the counter comment phase, where majority reiterated the services of OTTs and TSPs are not similar and the regulations governing TSPs cannot be used for OTTs. The CCAOI submission can be viewed using this link
